FURTHER INFORMATION

Safer Neighbourhood Team Officers teamed up with staff from the Safe Cam Team to assist the Junior Road Safety Officers from Eye Primary School to conduct a speed check. The idea was to promote road safety with the school children taking the lead. Whilst the session did not catch any speeding motorists, the day was successful in educating the children around keeping safe as a pedestrian, and the experience resulted in media coverage from the Eastern Daily Press, East Anglian Daily Times, and BBC Radio Suffolk.

Crime Prevention Surgeries were held at the libraries in Eye on Friday, 16th December, and Stradbroke, to offer advice on the latest crime prevention methods. Local residents were spoken to by officers from the Safer Neighbourhood Team and Crime Reduction Officer Nick Ray. This was done in partnership with trading standards who provided support and advice around scams and trading related matters. More of these drop-in surgeries will be arranged for the new year and the dates will be announced in due course.

Following routine enquiries for a suspected theft that occurred in another county. Officers attended an address in Eye and uncovered over two hundred items believed to be stolen. They were subsequently arrested and the investigation is ongoing.


Several incidents of anti-social behaviour were recorded for the villages of Wilby and Stradbroke. Local officers identified the suspects and through a thorough investigation, the suspects made admissions to several offences including Arson, Section 5 Public Order, and Criminal Damage. The offenders are awaiting a penalty for their actions.

The Safe Cam Team have been out during the month of December at the following locations – Brome, Palgrave, Stuston, and Weybread.

The team have been involved with reports of 20 theft from motorvehicles in Eye over a three week period. Of note, all vehicles were insecure at the time. Investigations are ongoing. The team would like to reiterate the importance of securing vehicles and to take all valuables out of vehicles before you leave them unattended.

Join Police Connect

Police Connect is a messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news for your area via e-mail, text or phone. There is no charge for this service - all messages you receive are free.

You can register to receive information about the issues that matter most to you and be among the first to be alerted by police in the case of an emergency affecting your area. You can choose to receive regular updates on crime and public appeals, safety advice and meetings and events. There is the option to receive information about a range of specific interest areas – such as 'rural' or 'rivers and coastal' – as well as updates for business owners and news from your Police and Crime Commissioner. The choice is yours.

How to register

The simple online process takes only a couple of minutes and will ensure we have the most up-to-date contact details and preferences for you. Just go to the Suffolk Police Web page and follow the link on the left hand side.

Crime Prevention Advice

Due to an increase in theft related crimes associated with motor vehicles in the Eye area we are reminding owners to make sure their vehicles are left locked when they are parked whether that is in public or within private grounds. Please also make sure that you do not leave any valuables on show which would attract the attention of anyone wishing to steal. If you do wish to discuss crime prevention advice or find out more about how you can mark your property then please contact the local SNT team.

Raising Community concerns

There are a number of ways you can get in touch with Suffolk Constabulary depending on the urgency and type of request. By telephone in an emergency always dial 999. Dialing 999 is a must if you are facing an incident or crime right now and you need police help immediately.

The Suffolk Constabulary non-emergency number 101 is the number to call when you want to contact police when it is less urgent than 999.

The non-emergency number is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Alternatively you can report a crime online.

If you want to speak to your local Safer Neighbourhood Team and it's not urgent using email will be quickest and if you want any member of the team they will get back to you within 24hrs. The SNT email address is: eye.snt@suffolk.pnn.police.uk

If you have an issue with how the police have handled a local community matter, such as dealing with an incident of ASB, or if you have an issue relating to something like a series of crimes occurring in your area, we advise that you speak to your locality Inspector Mark Jackson, to highlight your concerns. Inspector Jackson will be able to review the circumstances of the incident/matter and our response and make an assessment about how it is handled.
