

Occold is a small, rural village located in Suffolk at latitude 52.1748 N, longitude 1.0980 E and is 180ft (55m) AMSL (Above Mean Sea Level). OS map coordinates TM 157 707.

The total population is circa 520 (395 on the current electoral roll) in around 190 households.

At the annual meeting, hosted by Lynette Bulley on 13 January 2017, it was reported that the annual income totalled £411.39. However, it was noted that the sum of £150 set aside for donation to the school was not actually spent and so the sum was carried forward in the current bank balance. The Trustees resolved to allocate, for the benefit of all children in the parish, a sum of £100 towards the Jubilee Baptist Church Youth Club towards the cost of the annual trip. Stephen Hubner would liaise with the school headmaster to deliver the sum of £150 carried forward and with Mrs Dawn Crisp regarding the contribution to the Youth Club and the use made of these funds.

11. Local History

Local history projects completed or ongoing in 2017. Each one is archived alongside this report but over a period of time, they will be published in Oracle magazine.

Project	Description
Roll of Honour	Of the 15 names on the Roll of Honour, the family histories of 13 of them have been recorded. In most cases, it identifies ancestors back to the late 1700's and also identifies descendants where possible. During 2017, an additional 4 of these have been documented and published in ORACLE magazine. During 2018, it is hoped to publish these in a booklet to mark the Centenary of the end of WW1.
People of Occold	This is an online accessible database of families from Occold and surrounding areas. During 2017, around 400 names were added and it currently stands at 2,755 names and 637 families.

12. Website

The village website, <u>www.occold.com</u>, continues to be maintained on a daily basis by a volunteer Editor. Recent Government legislation means that the Parish Council is obliged to make certain documents freely available online hence Parish Council have taken over responsibility for the website.

During 2017, it received 9,500 visitors, or about 26 per day, from 111 countries.

As well as providing news items, events, organisations and local businesses, it also serves as a repository for local history information relating to people, places and events in Occold and important village documents e.g. Parish Council minutes and finances.

It also links to Residents of Occold Facebook page which is a useful resource for short term updates.

13. ORACLE Magazine

Parish magazine published 4 times yearly and distributed free to ~300 households in Occold.

It is kindly printed free by Envigo (formerly Huntingdon Life Sciences). Copies of the magazine are archived alongside this report.
